

Dear Friends,

My heart is filled with deep gratitude for the prayers, cards, calls, and Mass cards and enrollments that you sent me in remembering my sister, Annette Falkowski. She lived a very full life for her sixty-six years. Please continue to pray for her husband Glenn and her three children, Jolie, Daniel and Kelsey (and me, too). Our faith is our comfort and our strength.

We enter Holy Week with prayer, reverence, and gratitude. It is a time to reflect on the love and sacrifice of Jesus that led to the ultimate end of sin and death. We are encouraged to unite our sufferings with that of Jesus knowing that He understands our experiences.

On Palm Sunday, we proclaim Paul's letter to the Philippians (Phil. 2:6-11) The major lines are as follows: "Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God...emptied himself...He humbled himself...becoming obedient to the point of death...death on a cross. God greatly exalted him...At the name of Jesus, every knee should bend...and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father."

We can become so used to the yearly routine of Lent, Holy Week, and Easter. We can forget that the Son of God did not have to become human. He did not have to allow himself to die. What is the lesson here? Jesus models for us the emptying of one's ego, the obedience to God to love and to serve others, and the embracing of our inner poverty to be filled with God's grace.

Holy Week is not a re-enactment of history long ago. Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and Easter are part of our own experience several times during our life-time.

How many times do we go beyond our own wants and needs to help family, friends and strangers? How many times do people reach out to help us? We wash each others' feet. Sometimes people take us for granted. Some never give thanks. (us, too!) Often we look back and wonder how we ever got through a situation. We were fed by love, grace, the Spirit, and perhaps, most especially by the Eucharist, the Bread of Life.

We re-live Good Friday when part of ourselves dies. Perhaps, we have great loss in our lives. We grieve over a loved one, loss of health, job, home, etc. We cannot go back to the way things were. We feel empty.

We recognize the betrayed, suffering, and abandoned Jesus in our own inner selves. We see Jesus in those who are poor, those who are sick, have disabilities, those who are homeless, under or unemployed, and those who have no one to care for them. They are the face of Christ as well.

With the power of God working in us as it did in Jesus, may we allow God to use us as instruments of love and peace? It means that we have to live Philippians 2:6-11 and to surrender to a God that loves us passionately as His precious children.

May we all be open to the blessings that God wishes to give us this Holy Week.


#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION NEWS**
